The Florida Breast Cancer Coalition Research Foundation is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to ending breast cancer through advocacy, education and research. The Foundation awards grants for basic, clinical and translational breast cancer research, epidemiological studies of breast cancer, research linking breast cancer to environmental factors, and psycho-immunological research.

Funding for these research grants comes primarily through the sale of the End Breast Cancer license plate which requires that all monies fund research in the State of Florida. Since 2003, FBCCRF has funded Concept Awards through the DoD, as well as pre-doctoral and post doctorate research in Florida institutions. This year, we will also be funding Breast Cancer Research Fellowships in major cancer centers in Florida.

New Mechanism of Funding to support excellence in Breast Cancer Research

We will accept proposals that have been previously peer reviewed and received high priority score (NIH below 2.0), but not funded, through NIH or ACS grant mechanisms within the past 12 months. Funds will be limited to \$150,000/year with a maximum of 20% for in-direct costs.

Deadline for Submission

We cordially request that you submit your proposals together with the summary statements containing reviewer's comments and scores no later than April 15, 2009 for funding for the academic year 09-10.
